# Equator Principles III Reporting – FY17

The CBA Group became a signatory to the Equator Principles III (EPIII) in May 2014. The EPIII are a set of standards to assess, mitigate, manage and monitor Environmental and Social risk in project related financing.

#### **Equator Principles III and CBA**

The Equator Principles have evolved over time. The third iteration, EPIII, reflects the latest global developments in environmental and social risk management practices and associated governance around compliance.

By adopting EPIII, CBA builds on its commitment to responsible lending and formalises the reporting of our environmental and social risk practices.

CBA's EPIII practices and controls are embedded in CBA's loan origination policies, processes, key decision forums and reporting systems.


In addition to the initial EPIII face to face training, this year the relevant risk, relationship and product teams completed e-learning on Equator Principles III.

### **CBA's EPIII Reporting**

For the year July 2016 through to financial year ending June 2017, figure 1 shows 14 EPIII qualifying deals reached financial close. 13 deals were project finance (refer figure 2), and there was one UK solar power category B project related corporate loan.

Project financing included various major infrastructure projects and power generation in wind, solar and gas. Refer to Figure 3 below for details.
